Unit Plan Higher Education in the US: The Transition into College

This unit is geared toward Level 6/Transition ESL students and is divided into several parts to be completed over a few class periods.

Goals Objectives:

- The Level 6/Transition ESL students to identify their career goals and learn the proper means of applying to a college.
- Students will learn vocabulary associated with applying to a college or university.
- Students will create a plan identifying the steps they need to take to reach their individual career goals.

Materials:

- Copies of "Career and Intermediate Goals" and "Smart Goals Worksheet" from <u>Lesson Plan 7: Goal Setting</u> for each student
- Copies of vocabulary words for each student
- Copies of Wake Tech Application form for each student
- Students need pencils or pens
- Computers with internet (students may work in groups of 2 or 3)
- Copies of "College Bound Computer Scavenger Hunt for Information" worksheet for each student

Procedures:

Part One (One Hour)

Introduction: Goal Writing Activity

- 1. The introduction to this lesson is taken from the attached lesson: <u>Lesson Plan 7: Goal Setting.</u>
- 2. Follow the Lesson Procedures #1-4. Do NOT complete step #5, this will be completed at the end of this lesson once the students have learned how to get into college.

Vocabulary:

Part Two (One Hour)

- 1. Distribute the attached vocabulary sheet to the students.
- 2. Teacher uses direct instruction to teach the new vocabulary words to the students.
- 3. Put students into groups of two, and give each pair a vocabulary word. Have each pair write a sentence using that vocabulary words.
- 4. Give students time to write their sentences and then let them share the sentences with the class.

5. As a class discuss the sentences and make corrections as needed.

Activity:

Part Three (Two Hours)

- 1. Review vocabulary taught in Part Two of the lesson plan.
- 2. Give each student a "College Bound Computer Scavenger Hunt for Information" worksheet
- 3. Students are to work in groups of two or three to complete the answers on the worksheet.
- 4. Give the students about an hour to complete the activity.
- 5. Go over the answers with the students and answer any questions they may have.

Part Four (One Hour)

- 1. Give each student a Wake Tech application.
- 2. As a class, go through each part and allow them to fill it in.
- 3. Review any of the vocabulary previously taught or explain new vocabulary they do not understand.

Post-Activity:

Part Five (One Hour)

- 1. You are now going to complete step five of the attached lesson, "Lesson Plan 7: Goal Setting."
- 2. Give the students a copy of the "Smart Goals Worksheet"
- 3. Have students fill it out using the information they have learned about achieving their goals.
- 4. Have the students get into small groups and share their goals. Tell students to give each other ideas and recommendations in order to improve their peers' goals.
